Why animate text in PowerPoint?

- Focus audience attention on each point
- Prevent reading ahead
 - If the audience is reading, they're not listening
 - Avoid revealing the "punchline" too early
- Add interest to your presentation
 - Static slides may not be visually stimulating
 - Avoid "deer in the headlights" reaction to complex slides

What are some "best practices"?

- Use animation sparingly (one type per slide?)
- Keep animation style consistent among slides
- Avoid "gimmicky" effects (may be distracting)
- Animation speed is important
 - Fast-moving objects may be dizzying
 - Slow-moving objects are boring
- Practice your presentation
 - Are animations effective, and not distracting?
 - Avoid surprises during actual presentation

Where are the animation controls?

Click Animations tab on top menu:





 The Animations section is activated when you select a group of objects (text or picture) or an individual object

How do the controls work?

- Animate offers three commonly used animations from a dropdown list:
 - Fade (i.e. fade in)
 - Wipe
 - Fly In

 Change speed of effect with Transition Speed control:






How do the controls work?


- Custom Animation gives you greater control over animations than the Animate feature
- To add a custom animation:
 - Select an element on the slide
 - Click Custom Animation to open the Custom Animation pane
 - Click Add Effect to select one of the four types of effects:
 - Entrance
 - Emphasis
 - Exit
 - Motion Paths
 - Each type of effect has an extensive sub-menu to select specific animations and control their behavior





How do the controls work?

- When you have chosen an effect, use the Custom Animation pane to customize and manage it:
 - Remove the effect
 - Modify the effect's properties (varies by effect)
 - Manage the effect in the context of other effects
 - Play all the effects for the slide
 - Run the effects in Slide Show mode to test their behavior during an actual presentation
 - AutoPreview an effect you have selected



Who would like to try it?

1. Use Animate to make these points fade in together*:

- One for the money
- Two for the show
- Three to get ready
- Now go, cat, go!

2. Use **Animate** to make these items fly in separately:

- But don't you
- Step on my blue suede shoes!
- You can do anything
- But lay off of them blue suede shoes!

Continued on the next screen.....

Who would like to try it?

3. Use **Custom Animation** to make these points:

- a. Fly in from the right very fast
- b. Pinwheel in at medium speed
- Make this point fade in along with b
- Make this point fade in very fast, shimmer very fast, and disappear when the next point appears (Hint: requires Entrance and Emphasis effects in this step)
- e. Make this point fade in very fast.
 Then make the logo dissolve in and move in a circle.



Don't forget to make point **d.** disappear! (Hint: requires Entrance, Motion Path and Exit effects)
